Nominated Officer — Secretary

Ashley Popojas, 2nd term, Western PA District

Ashley Popojas is the Outreach Program Coordinator, Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments and Certified Orientation and Mobility Specialist at Western PA School for Blind Children (WPSBC) in Pittsburgh. She develops, facilitates, and coordinates special programming for students served in WPSBC's Outreach Program, and supports a staff comprised of 15 TVIs and COMS. Ashley also provides direct services for students from birth to age 22 throughout Western Pennsylvania. Ashley provides instruction for the University of Pittsburgh's Visual Impairment & Blindness Department of Teaching, Learning, & Leading. She proudly earned her bachelor's degrees in Corporate Communications and Business Management from Carlow University, followed by an M.Ed. in Early Childhood Education. Ashley graduated from the University of Pittsburgh's Vision Studies Program with dual TVI and COMS certifications. Ashley resides in Greensburg, PA, an eastern suburb of Pittsburgh with her husband, son, daughter and two puppies.

Deb Miller, 1st Term, Western Pennsylvania District

Deb Miller is a Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments and a Certified Orientation & Mobility Specialist at the Western PA School for Blind Children in the Outreach Program. She received a BA in Elementary Education from Westminster College and her M.Ed. through the Vision Studies Program from the University of Pittsburgh. She will graduate with her second master's degree from the University of Utah in May 2024 and will be certified as a Teacher of Students who are Deafblind. Deb began her career in Colorado Springs, CO as a TVI/COMS and worked as a Certified Low Vision Therapist as a part of the Colorado Low Vision Clinic team. She was also a board member of the Colorado chapter of AER. She has been employed with the Western PA School for Blind Children since 2010 as a TVI/COMS. For the past 11 years, Deb has collaborated with the Western PA School for the Deaf where she developed her interest in teaching children who are deafblind. Deb is also passionate about making the Expanded Core Curriculum meaningful to students educated in their home districts. She helped to create the Expanded Core Together program at WPSBC to build a community for students who are blind and visually impaired.
